## Advent Family Activities

- Adopt a missionary. Correspond with the missionary during the advent season and continue throughout the new year.
- Form an Advent group. Get together once a week at someone's home.
   Share the Advent story and dessert.
   Pray for each other during the Advent Season.
- Use the Advent story as the focus for a holiday party. Go caroling in your neighborhood or to senior adults from your church. Attend a local Christmas program at your church or school. Finish the evening with dessert and the Advent story.
- Worship with an Advent wreath.

  One beautiful tradition is that of lighting the candles of an Advent or Christmas wreath. Place four purple or pink candles, and one white candle, within an evergreen wreath. Begin four weeks before Christmas. Light one purple or pink candle each week as you read the suggested Bible readings for that day. Light the white candle on Christmas Eve or day as you pray and thank God for the birth of Jesus.
- Use a nativity scene. Make or purchase a nativity set. Select a set that is non-

- breakable so young fingers can touch and move the characters. Allow the children to move the figures while you read Luke 2:1-20.
- Worship through giving. Have the children decorate a jar or container to put pocket change in throughout the Advent Season. Give this money as a part of your Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. Many local charities provide opportunities for you to assist a needy family during the holiday season. Contact your church office, Salvation Army, or other charities for ideas.
- Sing or play Christmas music. Sing around your Christmas tree. Sing as a part of family worship. Sing while you do the dishes together or as you get ready for bed. Let your children hear Away in a Manger more often than a song about a reindeer.
- Build your own family traditions.

  Advent is a great time to help children build holiday traditions.

  Here are some ideas. Set aside a day for everyone to help decorate your home for the Advent/Christmas season. Schedule a movie night to watch your favorite holiday movies. Mixing the focus of secular and sacred is confusing to children.

  Home can be a place for both but keep them separate.
- On Christmas Day before presenting gifts to one another, read the Christmas story found in Luke 2:1-20 and have a time of prayer thanking God for sending us the greatest Gift of all. Impress upon your family the significance of giving and receiving gifts at this joyous occasion. Make it a celebration but keep the focus on Christ!
